CONNECTIONS

Can you relate what you read to another book, talk, podcast, topic?

- Connecting others to a larger key message is something I've heard before - did it in teaching - create alignment between me and the students against a bigger force
- Need a cohesive leadership team to be successful (The Five Dysfunctions of a Team)
- Thematic goal is different than BHAG (Jim Collins)

ACTIONABLE IDEAS

What are 2-3 actionable items that you can implement?

- Look at the organizations I'm involved in and see how we could implement this (and ask if silos are an issue)
- Download resources as mentioned on p. 186
